- Q4. (a) State four factors which influence curriculum change. (4 marks)
  - (b) Justify the use of specimen in biology teaching in secondary schools. (4 marks)

- (c) Explain seven objectives of teaching biology in secondary schools. (7 marks)
- Q5. Imagine you are a biology teacher taking over a form one class.

Your predecessor was teaching the topic "Nutrition in Animals." According to the scheme of work, you are supposed to teach the sub-topic "Definition and tooth structure of mammals" in a double lesson. (80 minutes)

The sub-topic has the following objectives:

The learner should be able to:

- (i) Draw and label a longitudinal section of a generalized tooth.
- (ii) Identify different types of teeth (incisors, canines, pre-molars and molars)
- (iii) Draw teeth arrangement in the sheep, dog, pig etc.
- (iv) Write down the dental formula of the sheep, dog and pig.

Prior to this lesson, the learners had covered definition, dental formula calculations and also discussed the general functions of the various teeth.

Question: Prepare a lesson plan which you would use to teach so that the stated objectives are achieved by the learner. (15 marks)

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
