QUESTION ONE [30 MARKS]

- (a) State the postulates and limitations of the Bohr's atomic model. **(4 marks)**
- (b) A sample of a liquid consisting of only C, H and O and having a mass of 0.5438g was burned in pure oxygen and 1.039g of CO₂ and 0.6369g of H₂O were obtained. Calculate the empirical formula of the compound. **(4 marks)**
- (c) Write the electronic configuration of the following species. **(4 marks)**
- (i) Si (ii) Mn³⁺ (iii) Br (iv) S²⁻ (v) Al³⁺
- (d) Draw the orbital diagrams of the following: **(2 marks)**
- (i) C (ii) [Ar]4s²3d⁴
- (e) Copper metal has two naturally occurring isotopes. Copper-63 which has relative abundance of 69.17% and isotopic mass 62.94amu and copper-65 which has relative abundance of 30.83% and isotopic mass 64.93amu. Calculate the atomic weight of copper. **(3marks)**
- (f) Describe the Rutherford model of the atom. **(3 marks)**
- (g) Calculate the wavelength lines (in nanometers) using the Balmer- Rydberg's equation when n₂= 1 and n₁=2 **(3 marks)**

- (h) Calculate the molarity of a solution made by dissolving 2.35g of H_2SO_4 in water and dissolving it to a final volume of 50 mL (2 marks)
- (i) Explain why the following combinations of quantum numbers are not possible (2 marks)
 (i) $n = 2; l = 2; m_l = +1$ (ii) $n = 3; l = 1; m_l = -2$
- (j) Draw the Lewis structure of O_3 and calculate the formal charges on O atoms (3 marks)

QUESTION TWO [20 MARKS]

- (a) Consider the following species: NO_3^- , BF_3 , NO_2 , XeF_4 :
 (i) Write the Lewis structure of each species (6 marks)
- (ii) Write the resonance structures of the NO_3^- ion (1½ marks)
- (iii) Determine the formal charge of boron in BF_3 (½ mark)
- (iv) Determine the molecular geometry and the bond angles of the XeF_4 and BF_3 (2 marks)
- (b) An aqueous solution of hydrogen peroxide (H_2O_2) is 30% by mass and has a density of 1.11 g/ml. Calculate: (6 marks)
 (i) the molarity of the solution (ii) the molality of the solution (iii) the mole fraction of H_2O_2
- (c) Calculate the energy in Kilojoules per mole of photons of FM radio waves with the frequency of 102.5MHz (2 marks)
- (d) Calculate the speed of an electron that has a de Broglie wavelength of 100 nm (2 marks)

QUESTION THREE [20 MARKS]

- (a) State the postulates of Dalton's atomic theory (3 marks)
- (b) Discuss the following intermolecular forces (6 marks)
 (i) Dipole-dipole forces (ii) Dispersion forces
- (c) Consider a Haber process in which 25.0 kg of N_2 and 5 kg of H_2 are reacted to form ammonia.

$$\text{N}_2(\text{g}) + 3\text{H}_2(\text{g}) \longrightarrow 2\text{NH}_3(\text{g})$$
- (i). Determine whether $\text{N}_2(\text{g})$ or $\text{H}_2(\text{g})$ is the limiting reactant (2 marks)
- (ii) Determine the amount of ammonia that formed in this reaction (2 marks)
- (iii) Calculate the number of moles of excess reagent remaining at the end of the reaction (2 marks)
- (iv) If 14000g of NH_3 is actually produced, calculate the % yield (1 mark)

- (d) Explain the period trends of the following properties (4 marks)
(i) atomic radii (ii) ionization energy

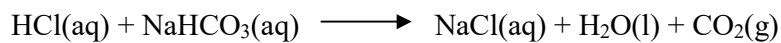
- (a) Sketch and label the Born-Haber cycle for KF(s) (5 marks)
